From the Senior Warden

What do you want to see Redeemer become? What are you willing to do to see that happen? We had



our February Vestry meeting last week and I was struck with a thought. “What is our responsibility in the maintaining the health of the church?” It is not enough, in my opinion, to say “I want....”


It is better to say, “I see this need and this is my suggestion for helping to accomplish it.”

I think that means we have to go over and beyond what are our normal instincts. We have a couple of pricy “wants” on the table right now. One is an AED and the other, new flooring for the sanctuary. We can’t just write a check and pay for these things. Why? Our budget is tight because we are paying for the Parish House bonds, and that cannot be defaulted on. At least a third of the income of the church goes to pay on the bonds each year and we have another 20 years until all is said and done.

Your Vestry struggles with this every month and some of us wrangle the bills every week. There are small funds which are designated funds and we’re using those as we can. But anything over and above the approved budget potentially impacts the salaries of those paid persons who serve us at Redeemer. We are here to represent you. We are listening and governing as best we can and trying to be faithful stewards. If you have any ideas or feel a call to be involved in deeper ways, please let me or a Vestry person know. We are working on long-range vision for Redeemer and your thoughts and prayers are crucial.

The Geometry of Life

During the months of March and April, the Artists' Place Gallery at the Episcopal Church of the Redeemer will be exhibiting the works of Renee Hoadley.

Renee writes: My artwork arises from that place deep within, where my rational mathematical side meets and harmonizes with my intuitive artistic side, creating visual images that blend my love of geometry and nature with my love of spiritual,

philosophical and psychological explorations of transformation. I attempt to create images that illustrate the interconnectedness of nature, humanity and the cosmos through the use of sacred geometry – a field I've been exploring since 2009.

My artwork often explodes with the full spectrum of colors, in an attempt to symbolize Infinity within the Unity of creation.

I also explore cosmic themes of multidimensionality, life and death, using outer space backgrounds combined with images related to memory, or places and things I love.

I often create paintings using acrylic as well as black light paints, showing two sides of one image - symbolizing the physical and metaphysical sides of reality.

Each painting is an offering to the Divine, meant to inspire others, as I give thanks for the beauty, joy and unity that life has to offer.
